ROAD TO ZERO HELMET SAFETY GAME

INSTRUCTIONS:

Use the template on this page to create your own chatterbox. Follow the steps on the following page which show you the cutting and folding process.

After Step 10 you will need to push your index fingers and thumbs into the triangle flaps to create the final shape in Step 11.

How to play:


- Begin with the thumb and index fingers of each hand in the four pockets of the chatterbox. Have the person you're playing with pick one of the helmet colours on the top four flaps.
- If the color is 'blue', spell out the letters of blue while alternating a pinching and pulling motion. After spelling out B-L-U-E, (i.e. four repetitions of the pinch and pull motion), the questioner will be showing a set of four numbers.
- The other player will then pick one of those numbers. The questioner will repeat the pinch and pull action for the chosen number.
- 4. The questioner asks the other player to pick a final number (from the four options shown in the opening).
- The questioner opens the fold of the selected number and asks the other player if the statement written inside about helmet safety is true or false.
- 6. The correct answer is shown below the statement.






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
INSTRUCTIONS:

Step 1.



Print a copy of the chatterbox template that is on the previous page.

Step 2.



Use scissors to carefully cut around the outside lines of the square chatterbox template.

Step 3.




Use pencils or textas to colour the pictures of the helmets. Each helmet needs to be a different colour.

Step 4.



Turn over the square, so the printed side (the one that has the words and pictures) is facing down.

Step 5.



Using the dotted lines as a guide, fold up all four corners so that the points meet in the middle.

Step 6.




It should now look like this.

Step 7.




Flip it over.

Step 8.



Fold up all four corners so that the points meet in the middle.

Step 9.



It should now look like this.

Step 10.



Fold the square in half. Lift up the squares slightly so that you can fit your thumbs under the bottom two squares and your index fingers under the top two.

Step 11.



With your fingers under the squares, press the corners toward the center of the chatterbox so each square forms a cone shape.

When you're finished, it should look like this.
